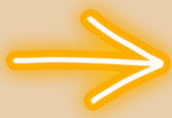

Dog's Body Temperature

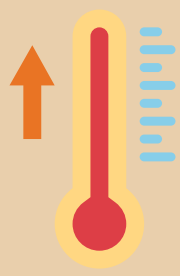


100.5-102.5°

Signs Of Heat Stroke

Heavy panting, difficulty breathing, excessive thirst.

Bright red tongue & mucous membranes, which turn gray as shock sets in.

Thick saliva, drooling, vomiting, and/or diarrhea.

Unsteadiness & staggering.

Lethargy.

***By the time the signs of heat stroke are visible, it's often too late.**

Dangers Of Heat Stroke

> 15 minutes of suffering can result in:

Collapse

Seizures

Coma

Organ Failure

Death
