INTRODUCTION

- Interactions with wildlife are a part of everyday life for residents.
 - Coyotes are found throughout Illinois.
- It is important to utilize strategies to best minimize the potential for negative interactions with wildlife.
 - To ensure a positive relationship between people & coyotes.

• Coyotes are an essential component of our landscape.

STATE & LOCAL LAWS

- In Illinois, coyotes are classified as a furbearer, and are protected by the Illinois Wildlife Code.
- A nuisance wildlife <u>permit</u>, issued by the Illinois
 Department of Natural Resource's district wildlife
 biologist, is required before a coyote can be removed.
 - Or, if a nuisance wildlife control operator holding a permit is hired for removal.

EDUCATION & COEXISTENCE

- The Village of Morton Grove promotes coexistence between coyotes.
- Our relationship to coyotes is directly affected by <u>our</u> behavior.
 - Coyotes react to us-through the cues we send to them.
- Education on local coyote populations will help guide residents in making appropriate decisions regarding their safety.
 - Including, managing their pets

- Residents must understand
 - the role they play in shaping the behavior of local coyote populations.
 - As long as coyotes are given their space (and are not injured or being fed by people), they do not typically pose a threat to people.
 - Do not create conflict where it does not exist.

ECOLOGICAL BALANCE

- Coyotes play a vital role in ecological balance.
- As Illinois' largest remaining predator, they are an integral part of healthy ecosystem functioning.
- Coyotes help keep populations of smaller animals in balance; including:



Rabbits, mice, voles, squirrels, Canadian geese, raccoons, skunks, opossums, white-tailed deer, etc.

REPORTING

- <u>Note</u>: Requests for service involving coyotes must be handled in accordance with Illinois Law & in line with best practices.
- Simply seeing a coyote does <u>not</u> make it a problem.
- Residents should contact their local police, to make a formal report.
- Categories:
 - Observation
 - Sighting
 - Encounter
 - Incident
 - Attack (Human or Pet)
- Report aggressive, fearless coyotes <u>immediately</u>.
- Gathering data on incidents allows for targeting conflict mitigation efforts to specific areas of need.
