
Electronics Recycling & Document Destruction Event

Saturday, May 15 | 9 a.m. to Noon Morton Grove Public Works - 7840 Nagle Avenue

All residents of Morton Grove and other Solid Waste Agency of Northern Cook County (SWANCC) communities are eligible to participate in this free event. IDs will be checked for proof of residency. Visit SWANCC's website www.swancc.org or call (847) 724-9205 for details including other drop-off locations and dates.

- · Drive up
- Wear a mask and remain in your vehicle
- · Keep a safe distance
- · Your items will be removed
- If you are experiencing COVID symptoms, stay home!

As a courtesy, please remove electronics from plastic packaging and boxes prior to the SWANCC event.



DO NOT bring: Dehumidifiers, Humidifiers, Air Conditioners, Vacuum Cleaners, Refrigerators or other large home appliances. SWANCC also provides a variety of other drop-off locations to assist residents with the task of recycling sensitive documents, electronics and other items diverting them from landfills.

DO NOT bring: paper in plastic bags. Plastic is a contaminant, as are photos, slides, and any non-paper item. Do NOT include magazines, greeting cards or newspapers, as they can be recycled curbside.

2021 Landscape Waste Collection:

March 16th to December 15th

Each year, residents have the option to pay per bag for landscape waste or can participate in the following subscription services:

Landscape Waste Bag or Bundle Program:

\$120.00/season: Subscribing residents may place up to three (3) landscape waste bags or bundles for collection per week. Each bag or bundle will not require a prepaid sticker.



Landscape Waste/Food Scrap Subscription Program:

65 Gallon Container \$140.00/season

95 Gallon Container \$160.00/season

Residents may participate in food waste composting by subscribing to the new 95 or 65 gallon landscape subscription program. Any bag or bundle placed outside of the cart will require a prepaid sticker to be affixed to each item. Food scraps can only be placed in the Groot provided container.

Landscape Sticker Program:

Residents can purchase landscape waste stickers to affix to each bundle or 30 gallon, two (2) ply kraft style landscape waste bag for collection. There is no limit to the number of landscape waste bags that will be collected. Stickers cost \$2.29 each and can be purchased at:

Morton Grove Welcomes New Food Scrap Program

The Village of Morton Grove has partnered with Collective Resource Inc. to provide residents with a new option to recycle food scraps. Collective Resource will provide residents with a food scraps collection container which is picked up weekly and taken to a commercial composting facility.

Composting reduces the volume of waste that is sent to the landfill and retains nutrients for future reuse. Fewer food scraps

sitting in a landfill means that less methane gas is created and precious space is not being used for food waste.





Composting also returns the

vitamins and minerals found in food scraps back to the Earth to promote healthy soil. Using nutrient-rich soil reduces the need for water, fertilizer, and pesticides in agriculture.








INVESTIGATED HISTORY OF CHICAGO'S PUBLIC TRANSIT













The Village has been designated as a US EPA Green Power Community, at zero cost to residents by creatively using our electrical aggregation capabilities. Residents' power consumption is offset by the purchase of Renewable Energy Certificates ("REC"s) from renewable energy such as wind and solar resources.

COVID-19 VACCINE INFORMATION

How soon can we get the vaccine and where?

We are continuing to see challenges nationwide and statewide throughout the vaccination process. The majority of the challenges can be attributed to the limited vaccine supply.

The Cook County Department of Public Health (CCDPH) remains the primary public source for vaccine access for residents of Cook County and Morton Grove. We are currently working with private pharmaceutical vendors to identify other available supply options and possible dispensing opportunities. Since municipalities don't control the distribution of vaccine, we are limited in the demands we can make of the private sector. We continue to work closely with Cook County to identify actions we can take in Morton Grove to increase the availability of vaccine to our residents. While we continue to seek opportunities, we encourage all residents to register with CCDPH at vaccine.cookcountyil.gov or by calling the Vaccine Sign-Up Hotline: 833-308-1988 M-F 7am-7pm.

What can residents expect regarding a local large-scale vaccination opportunity?

We are working with the county, state and private pharmaceutical vendors and all interested parties to have one or more local vaccination event(s). From the Village's perspective, our paramedics are trained to administer the vaccine, we are prepared to conduct an event at our Civic Center, and we are ready to receive/open a specific Village hotline for registration. What we don't have at this moment is a vaccine provider. We are confident that at least one of several opportunities will materialize.

How will residents be notified of a local large-scale vaccination opportunity?

Broad based distribution of the registration opportunity will be provided on social media and with our mass communication – reverse 911 phone system.

What can I do when I'm fully vaccinated?

- · Visit with other fully vaccinated people indoors without wearing masks or physical distancing.
- Visit with unvaccinated people from a single household who are at low risk for severe COVID-19 disease indoors without wearing masks or physical distancing.
- Refrain from quarantine and testing following a known exposure if asymptomatic.

For now, fully vaccinated people should continue to wear masks, practice physical distancing, and adhere to other prevention measures when visiting with unvaccinated people who are at increased risk for severe COVID-19 disease or who have an unvaccinated household member who is at increased risk for severe COVID-19 disease.

Beware of vaccine scams!

- The COVID-19 vaccine is FREE to all Americans. If anyone contacts you and asks for a payment to sign up, make an appointment, or reserve a spot in line for you to receive the vaccine IT IS A SCAM!
- · Please report any vaccine scams to local law enforcement.

Water Sprinkler Regulations

Each year the Village imposes restrictions on lawn sprinkling from May 15th- September 15th. Sprinkling is allowed daily during the following hours ONLY:

5 a.m. - 11 a.m. & 6 p.m. - 11 p.m.

These restrictions apply to all residential, commercial, and industrial properties. These restrictions do not apply to hand-held sprinkling hoses.
