


I hope one of your New Year's resolutions is to get more involved in our community. We are always looking for volunteers who are interested in making a local impact.

## 2018 Citizens Police Academy

Are you interested in getting an up-close look at what the police do? The Citizens Police Academy is a 10-week program designed to give participants an understanding of the challenges associated with law enforcement and the operation of the Morton Grove Police Department. Academy classes are held once a week and are approximately 2 hours in duration. Applications are available at the Police Station or on the Police Department's web page. The Academy will be held every Tuesday night from March 20 - May 22 from 6:30 pm - 8:30 pm at Village Hall. Graduates will be invited to join the Morton Grove Citizens Police Alumni Association.



The Morton Grove Police Department adheres to the philosophy of



Community Oriented Policing and is committed to developing partnerships with its citizens. The Citizens Police Academy provides an opportunity for citizens to develop direct lines of communication with the Police Department. Participants will develop a working knowledge of the department as well as its functions. It is hoped the instruction will strengthen police-community rapport through an educational process, increase understanding of police practices and procedures, and dispose of misconceptions. The Police Department, in turn, becomes more aware of the questions and concerns of Village residents and businesses.

## **Home Security Surveys**

Residents may request a Morton Grove police officer to visit their home and make a security survey. This program is designed to allow a police officer to inspect your home and make recommendations regarding changes that may improve your security. The officer will assess your home's security from a burglar's perspective.

- What may or may not attract a burglar to your home?
- Is there good visibility in and out which might allow neighbors and police to see a burglar?
- Are doors and windows difficult to defeat?
- Is there an alarm system in place to deter the burglar?
- Are belongings marked or inventoried in a way that might result in recovery and/or an arrest after the fact?

## **MGFD Winter Home Heating Safety Tips**

#### Watch What You Heat!

- Furnaces should be inspected and serviced by a qualified professional prior to the heating season.
- All chimneys and vents must be clear of debris.
- Wood-burning fireplace chimneys should be cleaned and free from creosote build-up (see below).
- Wood for your fireplace or wood stove should be dry and seasoned.
- Wood-burning fireplace screens should be metal or heat-tempered glass, in good condition and secured in front of the fireplace.
- A covered metal container should be used to dispose of cooled ashes.
- Keep children and pets at least 3 feet away from the fireplace, wood/ pellet stove, or space heaters.
- Portable space heaters should have an automatic shut-off and be plugged directly into an outlet not an extension cord.

#### **Wood-burning Fireplace Safety**

- Hire a "chimney sweep" at the beginning of the season to remove soot, creosote other debris from your chimney.
- Check the chimney for cracks, loose bricks, or missing mortar.
- Check the chimney cap to keep animals and rain from entering.
- **Burn Seasoned Wood (dried for 6 months)** Hardwood is best!
- Don't "over do" the fuel.
  - Small fires generate less smoke thus, less creosote build up. Fires that are too large or hot can crack the chimney.
- Use kindling to start the fire.

Never use a flammable liquid.



#### What is Creosote?

Creosote is a by product of combustion of a fossil fuel (coal, oil, wood, etc.). When wood is burned in a fireplace, the resulting smoke carries the creosote up the chimney. As the smoke cools, the creosote within it can condense on the interior of the chimney walls. If left uncleaned, subsequent fires can ignite the creosote left on the chimney walls. The resulting fire can spread into the adjoining walls and roof "undetected" by the home's occupants.

#### **KEEP YOUR WOODBURNING FIREPLACE CHIMNEY CLEAN!**

#### Please Help Keep Fire Hydrants Visible

The Fire Department appreciates resident's efforts to keep fire hydrants visible if they become obstructed by snow. If you see a hydrant leaking or damaged, call the Public Works Department at 847 470-5235.





## **Snow and Ice**

The winter season is upon us once again. The Public Works Department is prepared for winter and asks for your cooperation with the following:

- Try to not drive during, or immediately after, a storm unless it's truly necessary.
- If you have a driveway -use it. The more cars off the streets means P.W. can do their job faster and more efficiently.
- If you must park on the street, move your car as soon as possible to an area that is cleared of snow so P.W. can plow back the area where cars were parked.
- Most of all, be patient and considerate. Snowfalls are an inevitable part of living in the area and not worth possible injury to yourself or others.
- Remember to move your vehicle for any snowfall over one inch if you live on a SNOW ROUTE. Crews plow streets overnight.

The Village and the Solid Waste Agency of Northern Cook County (SWANCC) are accepting holiday lights for recycling at no cost to residents until Friday, March 24, 2018.

All string lighting and extension cords can be dropped off during normal business hours at the Village Hall lobby.

## **Public Works' Priorities During Winter** Storms

Please remember that Public Works prioritizes their efforts during, and immediately after, winter storms. Factors such as staffing levels, current weather conditions and time of day may mean that your local street may not be completely cleared of snow/ice immediately after a storm.

"Usual" winter storm priorities:

- Arterial streets to provide and maintain access for emergency vehicles and those who MUST travel.
- Side streets when arterials are passible.
- Alleys and parking lots.
- Sidewalks in business areas on Waukegan, Dempster and Lincoln.

Please be courteous and relocate vehicles parked on the street so snow can be completely removed.


